### From the Pastor:

In many ways, the flow of life in the United States follows the School Year, and in some respects this is true of our life together at St. Peter's. The first half of our liturgical year, which follows the great events in the life of Jesus, ended in May with the Festival of Pentecost, and we are now in the second half with focuses on our life as Christians in the world. In May, we finished our Confirmation Classes and our Wednesday Night Live sessions, and they will resume again in September. We have just finished a wonderful week of Vacation Bible School—so now we are ready for a summer break.

But some things continue throughout the summer at St. Peter's. We continue to have our weekly worship services, and we do encourage you to attend in our nicely air-conditioned nave. We also have weekly Sunday School classes for all ages—nursery through adult. At St. Peter's the basic essentials continue all summer long.

The Public Schools used to begin their new year after Labor Day, but now they begin in August. We have adapted to that at St. Peter's by making a change in our Sunday School schedule.

On Sunday, August 26<sup>th</sup>, we will observe "Christian Education Sunday." Our Sunday School teachers will be installed and we will present Bibles to our 5<sup>th</sup> Graders during the worship service. We will also be singing Sunday School songs that have been used here for decades, so they will be familiar to both children and adults. During the Sunday School period, we will have a special blessing of the children and their school backpacks and supplies, and our students will be promoted to their new classes. We are anticipating an enthusiastic turn-out on August 26<sup>th</sup> so that we can get our new Sunday School year off to a grand beginning!

Property Committee Report: a new high-pressure toilet has been installed in the handicapped stall of the woman's restroom and single-ply tissue will be used; the fan in the men's room is not working and will be repaired.

Unfinished Business: \$3,750 has already been donated for pre-buying heating oil during the summer in order to save money on heating costs for the upcoming winter.

New Business: a motion was passed that the Evangelism Committee will be responsible for weekly updates and Scripture references on the outside information board; there will not be a Council meeting in July – the next meeting will be August  $2^{nd}$ .

#### VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Our Vacation Bible School is over for 2018 and, again, it was a good year at VBS. We had some very hot and humid weather, especially on Monday and Tuesday, but it didn't dampen the spirits of either leaders or children.

Our Bible stories this year included Jesus calling his disciples, Jesus visiting Mary and Martha, Jesus reaching out to Zacchaeus, Jesus sharing the Last Supper with his disciples, and Jesus giving them the "Great Commission." In addition to our lesson time, there were many special things as well—crafts, music, science, snacks and games.

We also learned about God's good creation and the importance of conservation, and our Mission Project will tie into the care of the earth.

## **Pre-Buy Oil**

-The Finance Committee voiced their concern with the church's oil expenses and would like to start an annual early buy oil purchase beginning in August of 2018. From July 2017 to April 2018 we used a total of 6025 gallons to heat the church and parsonage, with the total cost being **\$13,885.58**. Pre-buying oil last August would have saved \$4,500.

-The Committee is taking steps to plan ahead financially and we are asking the congregation for help in making a difference, in an effort to help save dollars off of the 2019 oil expense. **Starting now until July 29<sup>th</sup> our goal is to raise \$8,750 dollars** in contribution offerings specifically to pre-buy oil at a discount summer price. All Pre-Buy Oil offerings will be a designated fund and will be held in the Capital Improvement Fund.
